1. **Matrix Health Group Memorial Scholarship**

Deadline: Aug. 1

Award: \$2,000

Scholarship Overview: Open to students who have been accepted to an accredited college, university, or technical school on a full-time basis. Students must be diagnosed with hemophilia or von Willebrand Disease or have an immediate family member who has been diagnosed.
