1. **Cameron Impact Scholarship**

Deadline: Sept. 13

Award: Up to \$50,000

Scholarship Overview: Open to students that will be graduating high school in 2018 and will be enrolling in college for the following year. Applicant must also be a motivated leader with strong work ethic and demonstrate active participation in community service.

6. **AfterCollege STEM Inclusion Scholarship**

Deadline: Sept. 30

Award: \$500

Underrepresented groups may be defined by: gender, race, ethnic background, disability, sexual orientation, age, socio-economic status, nationality and other non-visible differences with a minimum 3.0 GPA.
