1. **BMI Foundation Scholarships**

Deadline: Feb. 1, 2019

Award: Up to \$5,000

Scholarship Overview: Multiple Scholarships available from the BMI foundation for students pursuing a range of interests. NOTE: Most deadlines have been moved to January 1, however the Student Composer Awards deadline remains on February 1.

Award: \$10,000

6. **Davidson Fellows Scholarship**

Deadline: Feb. 13, 2019

Award: Up to \$50,000

Scholarship Overview: Open to students who are 18 years or younger. Applicant must submit a significant piece of work in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, literature, music, philosophy, or “outside the box.” Program is looking for students whose projects are at, or close to, the college graduate level with a depth of knowledge in their area of study.

7. **AFA Teens for Alzheimer’s Awareness Scholarship Essay Contest**

Deadline: Feb. 15, 2019

Award: Up to \$5,000
